A. Answer the following questions. Use the Future Perfect tense.

1. For how many miles will Tyler and William have paddled by the time they reach their destination? How long are they going to have been gone?

Tyler and William will have paddled for many miles by the time they reach their destination. They are going to have been gone for 2 weeks.

2. What sights are they probably going to have seen by the time their trip is completed?

They are probably going to have seen many wild animals by the time their trip is completed.

3. What will they not have seen by the end of their trip?

They will not have seen many people by the end of their trip.

B. Rewrite the following sentences as negative sentences, yes/no questions, WH-questions (using the underlined word or phrase) and tag questions.

1. They will have paddled for many miles by the time they arrive at their destination.

Negative: They will not have eaten many fish.

Yes/No Question: Will they have eaten many fish?

WH-Question: Who will have eaten many fish?

Tag Question: They will have eaten many fish, won't they?
