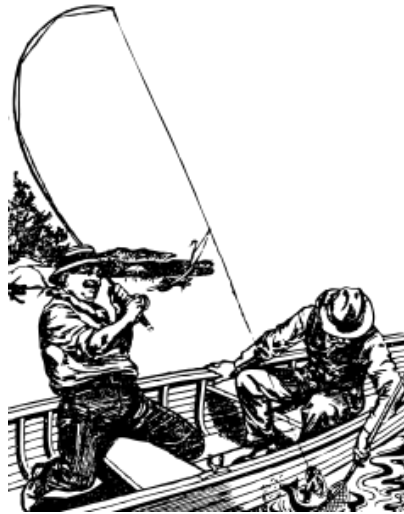


Future Progressive Story 1 (Future Continuous)

A. Answer the following questions. Use the Future Progressive tense.

1. Where will Brad be fishing this weekend? Who will be fishing with Brad?

Brad will be fishing at the lake this weekend. Mark will be fishing with Brad.

2. What else will Brad and Mark be doing at the lake? When will Brad be picking up Mark?

Brad and Mark will also be camping at the lake. Brad will be picking up Mark at 8 o'clock Friday night.

3. How long will Brad and Mark be driving before they get to the lake?

Brad and Mark will be driving all night before they get to the lake.

B. Rewrite the following sentences as negative sentences, yes/no questions, WH-questions (using the underlined word) and tag questions.

1. This weekend he will be fishing at the lake with Brad.

Negative: This weekend he will not be fishing at the lake with Brad.

Yes/No Question: Will he be fishing at the lake with Brad this weekend?

Tag Question: They will be fishing together for many years, won't they?
