In the previous lessons we went over the verb BE.

In this lesson we will start going over the verb DO.

The verb DO

Quick note:

In the [simple present tense](#) the verb DO has these two forms:

- I, you, we, they → **do**
- She, he, it → **does**

We will use these forms in our examples and exercises.

Now, before going over DO as a helping verb, it's important to go over some of its other basic meanings.

In this lesson we will go over two important meanings of the verb DO.

The meanings of the verb DO:

1. To perform an action

I can't **do** it.

This is not a smart thing to **do**.

This is not a nice thing to **do**.

What can I **do**?

You should **do** your job.

He **does** dangerous things.

She **does** some cooking.

He has a few things to **do**.

She must **do** the dishes now.

2. To make something

Tim **does** a painting.

I **do** the food for the entire family.

Chris **does** drawings for a living.
